Constitutional Amendment 1516.2

Constitutional Change of Senate Membership

SPONSOR(S): Matthew Cassidy

DATE: September 2, 2015

Whereas: The membership of the senate is not defined clearly in the current SGA Constitution.

Be it Hereby Resolved, The Student Government Association of Rollins College will:

(1) Make the following changes to the Constitution

1. Change Article VII, Section 2, Subsection A.; The Senate will be comprised of the following officers in the following order: Vice-President of SGA, the President Pro Tempore, the Parliamentarian, the Assistant Clerk of the Senate, the four elected members representing each class year from A&S, the four elected members representing the Hamilton Holt School and ten additional “at-large” representatives, all of whom will be confirmed by the senate;

3. Add to Article VII, Section 2, Subsection C. I. iii. All class and Holt senators must serve on at least 1 Student Government Association Committee and all other “at-large” senators will serve as a liaison for a campus organization and can be part of a Student Government Association Committee.

(a) These organizations are to be determined annually by the President and Vice-President and then confirmed by the senate by a majority vote.

4. Change Article III, Section 1 subsection M; Class Senators shall run for office at the same time as the President and Vice-President

5. Change Article III, Section 1, subsection N; In the event that Executive appointment consists of newly elected Senators, a special election may be held in the Fall Term concurrent with first year senator elections to fill the vacated seats. “At-large” senator candidates run for the seat appropriate to the organization they wish to represent. This election, unlike the others, will be voted upon by the senate and these senators will take office immediately after all the open “at-large” senate seats have been filled. The Chief Justice will oversee the application and voting process for this election.
