Bill: Limit on Legislation

DATE: September 16, 2015

Whereas: Currently, there is no limit to the amount of legislation one senator can present at a meeting.

Whereas: All the senators should express their opinions, and have their voices heard equitably in the senate by sponsoring legislations.

Whereas: Senate members have expressed concern over the topic of senate meetings being inefficient due to the number of legislations passed by a particular senator in any one given meeting, and the insufficient effort to consolidate several legislation into one.

Be it Hereby Resolved, The Student Government Association of Rollins College will:

(1) Limit the number of legislations that can be sponsored or cosponsored by a senator to three pieces of legislation per senate meeting.

(2) If urgent, more than three legislations can be sponsored by one senator if given direct permission by the President or Vice President of SGA.
