



History of Crummer School (1984 - 2007)



s the celebration of the 50th year of the Crummer School draws to a close we want to celebrate the great strides that recent leaders have made. Since 1984, the school has received national and international recognition and is poised for further growth. We look forward to charting the future for the next 50 years.

1986

Crummer Graduate School of Business earns AACSB accreditation.

At the time, Crummer was one of 216 accredited business schools, and one of only 16 accredited institutions that specialized in graduate education.



1987

Introduction of a new computer system in classroom

The Crummer School introduced a new computer system that allows students to individually interact with a central computer system from every desk in the classroom.

Dean Samuel Certo (1991 - 1993)

Five years after joining the Crummer School faculty, Samuel Certo was appointed

Dean. During his tenure as Dean he worked to increase the emphasis on technology in the classroom. He also recognized the value of an internationalized curriculum and added international internship programs, foreign language options, and established the 'Global Summit' as student learning opportunities. His international programs were the forerunners of Crummer's current international curriculum and practica.

Certo has been named the Steinmetz Professor of Management and has continued to teach at Crummer. He has been recognized for his efforts by receiving the Charles A. Welsh Memorial Award for outstanding teaching and won an innovative teaching competition sponsored by the Deans of the Southern Business Administration Association. During Crummer's recent 50th anniversary celebration, alumni voted Certo 'The Most Challenging Professor' from 1983-2006.

History of Crummer School (1984 - 2007)

Dean Edward A. Moses (1994-2000)

In 1994, Dr. Edward A. Moses was named Crummer's fourth Dean. Under Moses' leadership, the curriculum continued to expand. New opportunities for study included the Center for Enterprise Management, the Early Advantage MBA for recent college graduates with little or no work experience, and the Accelerated MBA for fast-track executives. Moses also continued to expand the "Global Business Practicum" and in 1998 launched the National Business Practicum which enabled students to work on extended projects with American companies.

In addition to expanding the curriculum, Moses oversaw the external funding and expansion of the Crummer School's facilities. In 1999, the Bush Executive Center was constructed adjacent to Crummer Hall; this facility provided the space needed for enhanced delivery of advanced business educational programs.

During Moses's tenure, the Professional MBA Program was recognized by *U.S. News & World Report* as one of the nation's top 25 part-time MBA programs. In addition, the school achieved a significant and long-sought milestone when *Forbes* magazine named Crummer as one of the Top 25 Regional Graduate Business Schools in the country.



Dr. Moses continues to teach at Crummer as the Bank of America Professor of Finance.



History of Crummer School (1984 - 2007)

Dean Craig M. McAllaster (2000-Present)



Prior to becoming Dean, Dr. Craig M. McAllaster served for six years as Assistant Dean and Director of Crummer's Professional MBA and Executive MBA programs, In July 2000. Rollins College named McAllaster the fifth Dean of Crummer School.

Under Dean McAllaster's leadership, the Crummer School established the Center for Management and Executive Education in 2001. Two years later, the Center for Entrepreneurship and the Center for Leadership Development were launched. In response to the market demand, the program offerings were expanded to include the Saturday MBA program in 2005.

The Crummer School continues to receive national recognition during Dean McAllaster's tenure. In 2001. Forbes magazine ranked Crummer the 12th Best Regional Business School in the United States and Beta Gamma Sigma recognized the school as a premier chapter of the honorary business fraternity. The Crummer School was recognized by Forbes again in both 2003 and 2005. In Forbes most recent rankings based on return on investment, the Crummer School ranked 37th nationally out of 480 AACSB accredited schools and 20th among private universities. The Crummer School remains the number one MBA program in Florida.

The Forbes study was published in the September 3 issue of the magazine. "Based on return on investment, this ranking provides an unbiased evaluation of the economic value of a Crummer School degree," said McAllaster.
