Highlights from reports to the Trustees

- Strategic planning priorities identified by the planning committees (Academic Excellence, Student Success, Areas of Distinction, and Sustainable Business Model) have been arranged into three thematic areas: Engaged Lifetime Learning, Improving Institutional Effectiveness, and Streamlined Pathways to Success. The strategic plan will be the main topic of the Board of Trustees annual retreat in October.
- The 2012 fiscal year concluded with a balanced operating budget and a small net surplus. As of May 31, 2012, the endowment was valued at \$333.4 million.
- Construction continues on schedule for The Alfond Inn at Rollins (due for a July 2013 soft opening) and the Archibald Granville Bush Science Center (scheduled to reopen in August 2013). This <u>time-</u> <u>lapse video</u> captures the progress of construction on the Bush Science Center since beginning in March 2012.
- Olin Library renovations and Strong Hall (phase I) were completed for fall semester opening, and the Cahall-Sandspur Field Press Box ("Officials' Stand") was completed for the fall soccer season.

Linking students, alumni, and careers

PLC Contemporaries

SESi

Rollins' Social Entrepreneurship and Sustainability initiative (SESi) has gained momentum with Ashoka U's recent designation of Rollins as a Changemaker Campus. SESi continues to promote successful social entrepreneurship by offering Rollins students skills training and collaboration opportunities.

Enhancing spiritual life on campus

Following up on a previous PLC recommendation, Rollins has formed a spirituality task force to review and expand opportunities for spiritual life on campus. Dr. Patrick Powers, dean of the Knowles Memorial Chapel and chaplain to the College, has engaged students, faculty, and staff with assistance from Rev. Bryan Fulwider, former pastor of the First Congregational Church of Winter Park.
