- Approval of November meeting minutes
 - Motion to accept: Ed, Blake seconded. Passed.
- Share Holt Pathways to Global Citizenship
 - Developed a CLA Pathways to Global Citizenship last year (<https://www.rollins.edu/global-initiatives/documents/map-to-global-citizenship.pdf>)
 - Created a different version for Holt – rather than a 4-year roadmap, different levels of involvement.
 - Have shared with folks at Crummer and are thinking about ways to get it out to Holt students. Plan to present it during class visits to Holt INT200 courses.
 - Holt students are often not aware of global opportunities so this should be helpful.
 - Also working on a Crummer version that will be more focused on connecting competencies with activities and content within the Crummer program and on the value of global citizenship for business leaders
- Input on Global Initiatives Website (<https://www.rollins.edu/global-initiatives/>)
 - What other information should we have on the site?
 - Are there ways we can structure it more effectively?
 - How can we lift the work of the committee more – like the index for global engagement and the student pathways to global citizenship?
 - Structure: maybe keep all opportunities for faculty and staff together in one section, same with students
 - Why is global engagement a sub-section when the whole site is about global engagement?
 - Should the global engagement index have its own tab to draw attention to that tool?
 - Blake can speak to Rachel in Olin about the possibility of a Global Scholarship collection within the library repository for faculty scholarship. We could then link to this collection from the site.
 - Don't date the photos.
 - Include lists of participants and itineraries for past RIG grants – possibly a link to a Sharepoint folder rather than adding a lot of documents to the site
 - Add examples of successful past grants to help people who are submitting proposals
 - Highlight what people have done in the RIG grants afterwards in classes and research.
 - Obvious path to Global Initiatives from the Current Students tab – there isn't one!
 - Maybe add post-graduate international opportunities for students as we are seeing interest in this and it's not really appropriate for the International Programs site.
- Publicity and timing for GIC and RIG grants
 - Timeline for call for proposals for a RIG seminar for 2022-23:
 - Decide at April meeting
 - Due in early April – April 8
 - Call out no later than mid-February
 - RIG workshop:
 - Friday 3/4 12:00-1:00

- In-person with possibility for virtual – record the session
- Structure: present the application and process for the different types of grants, then have one past seminar leader, one seminar participant, and one individual grant recipient speak briefly, then open to Q&A
- Provide boxed lunches to go
- Set up an RSVP
