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## SLC Meeting April 7, 2020

- V. Community Standards Presentation
  - a. Data for 2019-2020
    - i. Educational conference—first time coming through community standards, low-level offense, no record with the institution
      1. 182 total, 122 fall and 60 Spring
        - a. rise in comparison to previous years, highest since 2015
    - ii. Hearings—second violation or more serious offense, includes a record
      1. 143 total, 84 in fall and 59 Spring, highest since 2015
    - iii. Responsible Action Protocol (RAP) —alcohol or drug-related issue where someone reached out for help; student is provided with resources and no record is taken (amnesty)
    - iv. **Note**—rise in numbers might be linked to increased housing density, students with additional roommates
  - b. Educational Conference Feedback—collect survey and open-ended data about the process
    - i. Benefit—because students know there will be no record, they feel more comfortable being honest and open; builds rapport
    - ii. Work with Wellness Center and Counseling Services to provide resources to intervene in poor decision-making
    - iii. Trying to determine if the process needs adjustment
    - iv. Attempt to connect staff members with students based on the staff members' skills and personality and the nature of the student's issue/perspective
  - c. Impact of COVID-19
    - i. Students are feeling really overwhelmed with the transition to online learning, in combo with natural stress at end of semester
    - ii. Monitoring for online behavior on social media and/or discussion groups—CSR policy violation vs. just rude behavior or an issue of wellbeing?
      1. Nancy asks about language for e-etiquette
        - a. some language already exists, but we may not have anticipated some of the challenges associated with online learning

- b. Nancy notes the importance of adding expectations to syllabi
  - iii. Potentially more academic integrity cases
  - iv. Numbers will go down because not on campus—no physical altercations!
- d. Next Steps
  - i. Hybrid model—educational conferences and hearing
  - ii. COVID-19
    - 1. finishing up existing cases
    - 2. working with Wellness Center who have outstanding CAPS sanctions (alcohol and drug education to address substance abuse issues)
    - 3. Other projects
      - a. Grad student staff is working on training for fraternity and sorority life conduct boards—how do they keep members accountable?
      - b. Title IX informal resolutions
  - iii. Policy Updates
    - 1. Disruptive behavior policy
      - a. a policy already exists that applied to on-campus/campus corridor behaviors such as disrupting neighbors
      - b. new push to focusing on in-class behaviors, Dr. Barraenache is taking the lead on this and it will be re-introduced in the fall
    - 2. Damage to Property/Fire Safety policies—burnt thermostats (students hold lighter to thermostat to kick on the AC, linked to tripled rooms and issues with humidity/heat in rooms)
    - 3. Smoking and Tobacco Use policy—needs to be updated to reflect increase in age minimums to 21
      - a. includes vaping and e-cigarette use in buildings
      - b. can refer to smoking cessation program with Wellness Center
      - c. challenge of implementation: will security actually card students to check that they are 21?
      - d. Nancy asks about violations by faculty and staff; Maeghan recommends reaching out to Matt Hawks in HR
    - 4. Title IX—need to adjust to changing federal guidelines
  - iv. Motion to approve minimal policy changes (Amy Parziale)
    - 1. Second (Sarah Parsloe)
    - 2. APPROVED
