Our goal will be to disentangle, through a selective study of film, fiction, and historical narratives, the myths, stereotypes, and realities that define our *Images of Africa*. Films to be viewed will include *The Gods Must Be Crazy*, *Wend Kuuni*, *Mountains of the Moon*, *A World Apart*, and *Mississippi Masala*.
