Bill: Financial Support for Appropriate Attire

Whereas: SGA has a specific dress code that needs to be followed in order to attend the meetings in an appropriate fashion.

Whereas: Not everyone that is a member of senate, or potential member of senate, can afford the wardrobe items necessary for SGA meetings.

Be It Hereby Resolved, The Student Government Association of Rollins College Will:

- 1. Allocate \$100 for a senator in need to purchase clothing that is appropriate for senate meetings of the Rollins SGA.
 - a. To qualify for this sum of money, a senator will need to prove their financial strain. They can provide any documentation or proof that they are comfortable with proving their financial need.
 - b. Once a senator receives this money, they will need to provide a receipt or some form of proof that the money received was allocated to professional clothing appropriate for senate meetings.
 - c. This request will go through the SGA advisors with the input of the financial chair instead of being presented to the whole senate so that the matter is treated with the proper sensitivity and empathy it deserves.
 - d. The money will be given on a gift card or in another system that is not reimbursement. The senators receiving this aid will likely not be able to produce the money themselves to be reimbursed and the transaction should be made as simple as possible.
