- Legislation 1819.20: Senator Standards
  - Sponsor: Hali Reedy, Sydney Brown

- Issue Addressed: SGA senators currently only need to have two constituent outreaches and one legislation per semester. To represent SGA better on and off campus, it should be required for senators to complete 5 hours of logged SGA service and attend one-non SGA event
  - Result: Approved, legislation passes
- Legislation 1819.21: Hamilton Holt Open Form
  - Sponsor: Madison O'Malley Kress, Maximiliano Castrillon
  - Issue Addressed: Rollins College should support all student led events. The Hamilton Holt School hosts at least two constituent outreaches per semester catered to the students of the Evening Program. They will host an open forum for Holt students to ask questions and give suggestions. Moving forward, SGA will allocate \$489.45 to provide materials for the open forum.
  - Result: Approved, legislation passes
- Legislation 1819.22: Sex-Ed
  - Sponsor: Kalli Joslin and Pilar Macias
  - Issue Addressed: Health & Wellness is required for all Rollins students. The education on gender and sexuality in these classes are inconsistent. Rollins is a diverse community and learning about this topic will foster informed and inclusive dialog on campus. Moving forward, SGA will endorse a more consistent and inclusive curriculum regarding gender and sexuality, recommend guest speakers, and assist curriculum committee in adapting the curriculum.
  - Result: Approved, legislation passes
- Legislation 1219.23: Cornell Campus Center Hour Change
  - Sponsor: Caroline Klouse and Jessica Gonzalez
  - Issue Addressed: The Cornell Campus Center Marketplace currently serves full-service breakfast from 7:30-10:30am. Students with 8am classes must rush from the CC to their class. They also serve their full-service dinner from 5:30-8:30pm, which is problematic for students with Holt classes running until 9:15pm. Moving forward, SGA will show this legislation to Dining Services and work to change their breakfast hours to 7:00-10:30 and their dinner hours to 5:30-9:30pm.

- Legislation 1819.23: Tenure Track
  - Sponsor: Caroline Klouse and Jessica Gonzalez
  - Issue Addressed: In the subsection of the Evaluation of Adjunct Faculty within Section II of the Rollins College Faculty Handbook, it explains how, in terms of adjunct faculty, the faculty member is subject to a candidate screening process and a search committee would commence with the Dean and a representative from Human Resources at Rollins. However, nowhere in the candidate screening, for adjuncts and non-adjunct faculty, does the search committee refer to direct student input during this process of hiring or promoting faculty to tenure track positions. For a faculty member, the position of tenure allows for them to receive ensured employment and financial stability at Rollins College. The subsection of the Policy on Retirement Benefits for Tenured Faculty within Section II of the Rollins College Faculty Handbook states that the Retirement Plan is only applied to "tenured faculty who are at least 60 years of age, but not more than 70 years of age, and whose age plus years of full-time Rollins service total at least 75 on or before the effective date of retirement shall be eligible to participate in the Plan." (p. 31). As of April 8, 2019, 112 students at Rollins College have signed a "Rollins College: Tenure Track Review" petition calling for more student input and a review of the administration when considering faculty for tenure track positions.

  - Legislation 1819.24: 5th Annual Rollins Rally to End Violence
    - Sponsor: Kyla Snow, Jack Gabriel, Durston Gagliano
    - Issue Addressed: The Office of Title IX at Rollins College organizes the Rollins Rally to End Violence every year during Sexual Assault Awareness Month at the end of April. Many organizations will attend and provide resources, workshops, activities, etc. Moving forward, SGA Fox Funds should provide \$500 to the Office of Title IX, primarily used for promotional items to raise awareness on campus.
