Academic Affairs Committee Meeting Minutes
December 12, 2006

1. The minutes from the November 28, 2006 meeting were approved.
2. New Business
 - a) We will continue to meet at 8:15 am every other week next semester. If it becomes necessary to meet every week, we will do so. The first meeting will be on January 23. Hoyt Edge said he talked to Steve Miller of Student Government about the need for student representatives to attend the meetings. An election will need to be held to replace Carolyn Carpan, who will be on sabbatical next semester. Thank you to Carolyn for her hard work as Secretary.
 - b) The Honors Proposal wasn't presented at the last faculty meeting due to time constraints. This will go on the agenda for the spring.
 - c) Issues to address next semester:
 - Policy regarding team teaching
 - International credits
 - Bylaw change re. advisory committee for faculty positions
 - d) Sherry Fisher presented the proposed changes to the Academic Internships program. Reasons for proposed changes include a large rise in the number of summer internships and the inconsistency of the academic appeals process related to academic internships. The proposed changes are:
 - Students with minimum of 30 hours of credit may seek academic internship;
 - Maximum of 12 semester hours of credit may be counted towards graduation;
 - Remove academic probation as a restriction to internships

After Sherry Fisher left the meeting, we voted unanimously to approve the minimum of 30 hours of credit to participate in the academic internship program and the maximum of 12 semester hours of credit may be counted towards graduation. We voted 7-1 against the removal of academic probation as a restriction to internships. Sharon Carnahan suggested adding a phrase to the guidelines stating, "Students on academic and/or social probation are not permitted to register for internships."

The next AAC meeting will be on January 23 at 8:15 am in the Warden Dining Room.
