You will find enclosed our 1964 Class Profile and a new brochure, which briefly describes Rollins of today. You should have received already under separate cover a completely reorganized catalog, new in design and format. We are proud of this new publication and we hope you find it readable and concise. We recognize that the single catalog that we mail most schools is not enough for your counselling needs. **Would you write immediately if you need more Rollins catalogs.**

Won't you please refer to pages 36 and 37 of the catalog. There you will find described our new Foreign Service program and our expanded Study-Abroad plan. Already we have several applications from students who believe they can qualify for the Career Abroad curriculum. As you will note, enrollment is limited in this area.

This winter we will announce a plan about which I am personally very excited. It will enable the college to continue to offer a superior education for students in the 500 College Board range, but at the same time, provide studies in depth for very bright students. We believe the plan will be unique in American higher education.

As in past years, we will hold our annual Rollins Conference on our campus January 22 to 24. In order that different schools may be represented at the Conference, we invite, in the main, a different group of school counselors each. This year we shall have 30 out-of-state and about 50 Florida schools represented. Our admissions staff remains the same. Last year's experience will permit us to plan more efficiently. Hopefully we shall visit 600 schools in Florida, the Northeast, and selected areas throughout the nation.


Admissions procedures remain the same as those outlined in our Fall Newsletter of 1963. **It does seem necessary to urge early application (before February 1), since many later applicants were denied adequate consideration last year.**

The 1964 application form has been revised to require a writing selection from our applicants. In a sense, this will be our "Writing Sample" and will be used to judge the applicant's facility and correctness of expression. Rollins does not require the College Board Writing Sample.

All of us on the staff are looking forward to renewing our contact with our many school friends throughout the nation. It should go without saying that you are always welcome on our campus. You will find us in a new suite of offices in Carnegie Hall, where we have a friendly cup of coffee waiting for you. Come see us when you can.
