An Act

To create accessible parking at Rollins College.

***WHEREAS** Rollins College has had a growing accessibility issue in most facets of student life;*

***WHEREAS** there is a substantial lack of properly located handicap spaces at Rollins College;*

WHEREAS there is a significant issue in handicap parking sizing, with the smallest space measuring at 7.25 feet thus far: Now, therefore,

Be it Hereby Resolved, the Student Government Association of Rollins College will:

- (1) Continue existing communications with the Director of Facilities Services for Landscape & Grounds, Mary Edwards, and Ken Miller which will entail;
 - (i) Reviewing and adding to the comprehensive file on all current handicap spaces on campus, including the location, the sizes, and the number of handicap spots within Rollins College jurisdiction;
- (2) Establish a plan to relocate an adequate number of handicap spots located by each residential building and office on campus, which will replace regular parking in these areas;
- (3) Resizing all of the handicap spaces within Rollins College jurisdiction to meet the guidelines and laws recommended by the state of Florida and the City of Winter Park;
