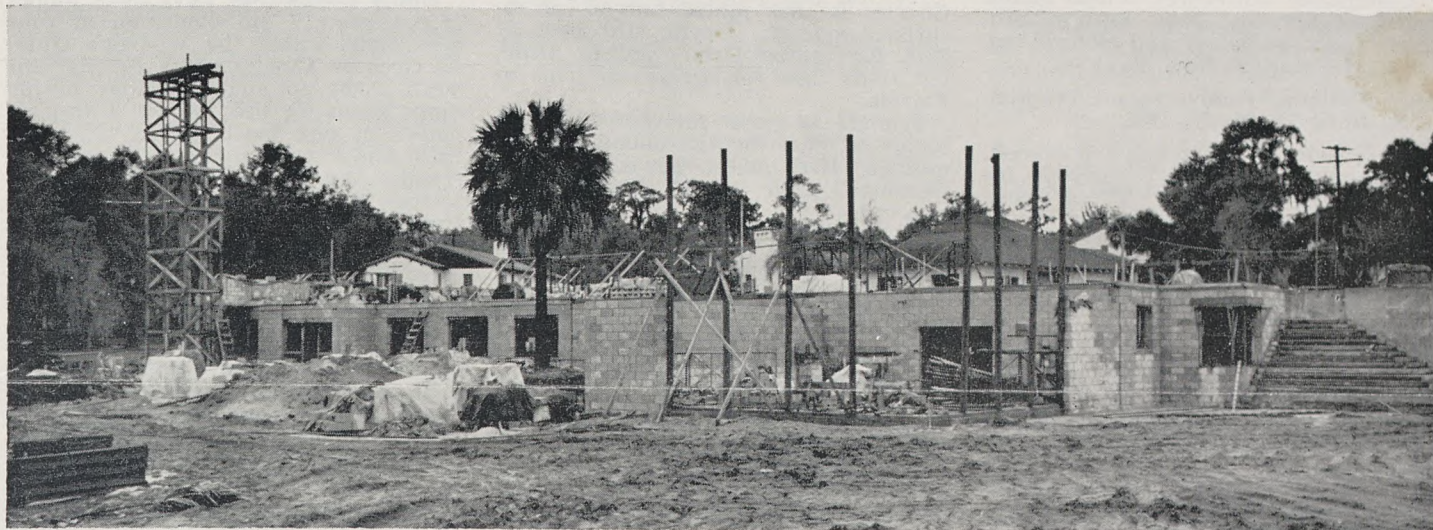

TAX CREDIT

For several years the American Alumni Council has advocated some measure of tax relief for the parents of college and university students. Recently the President's Committee on Education Beyond High School issued the following statement. "The Committee recommends that the Federal revenue laws be revised, with appropriate safeguards, in ways which will permit deductions or credits on income tax returns by students, their parents or others who contribute to meeting their expenditures necessarily incurred in obtaining formal education beyond high schools; and, further, that the provisions be included which will grant proportionately greater tax benefit to those least able to afford those expenditures."

SURVEY

Alumni House continues to seek information about graduate work that has been done or is being done by graduates and former students. So far the names and degrees of 334 who have gone on from Rollins for advanced work have been listed. Of these 105 have earned doctors degrees and 229 masters.

CHRISTMAS CAROL

For the seventeenth year Dean Emeritus, A. D. Enyart, read Dickens' 'Christmas Carol' in the Annie Russell Theatre just before the Christmas holidays at Rollins.
