## CONVOCATION

Judge Harold H. Medina, of the U.S. District Court in New York, who became famous during the 1950 communist trials in which 11 men were convicted and sentenced, was the speaker at the 72nd anniversary convocation Monday, Nov. 4, in the Knowles Memorial Chapel.

His topic was "Liberal Arts and The Whole Man." He said: "The only road to happiness is through a sense of fulfillment of our destinies. We must try to discover what our destiny is and then try to fulfill it. It is the function of a liberal arts college to make its students build up their spiritual strength."

He was greeted with a standing ovation at the close of his address and the honorary degree of "Doctor of Divinity" was conferred on him by President McKean.

## CHAMPIONS

The Rollins Soccer Team defeated the Stetson Hatters in the last game of the season to gain the Florida Intercollegiate Soccer Conference championship, in the Sandspur Bowl, Saturday, Nov. 23. In a schedule of two games each with Stetson, Jacksonville and Florida Southern, The Tars lost only one game, that to Stetson, Nov. 2, by one goal. The score for the closing game was Rollins 5, Stetson 2.

Rollins won from Jacksonville by scores of 4-1 and 1-0, from Florida Southern 3-0 and 5-2.

The newly formed Soccer Conference in Florida finished the season with increasing interest being shown in the game which was introduced just this year.

At press time it was announced that a game had been arranged between the Tars and team from the Nassau Soccer League for Nov. 30, in Nassau.

## NEEDS STUDIED

The American City Bureau of Chicago, has been retained by the Trustees of Rollins to make a study of the College and prepare a development plan leading to the Diamond Jubilee Year in 1960. Mr. Maynard Hammond a representative of the company has been on campus for several weeks.

Mr. Hammond states that the purpose of the study is to determine the needs and opportunities of Rollins so that they can be presented in a crystal clear fashion to the citizenry of the nation.

He has found that, "Rollins is an excellent institution which has made considerable gains in the last few years and has boundless potentials for the future."

"It has solidified its gains and stepped further out into a position of academic leadership for four main reasons." These are:

(1) The academic excellence of the student body.

(2) The teaching staff which is constantly improving.

(3) The efforts which are being extended to rapidly improve the campus and facilities.

(4) The outstandingly fine administration.

Mr. Hammond also stated that "there will never be a time when no improvements will be needed. It is, however, the desire of the administration to make these improvements as rapidly as possible."

## ESSO GRANT

Rollins College has received a \$2,000 grant from the Esso Educational Foundation, an organization of the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey. The Foundation was established in 1955 to assist privately supported Colleges and Universities in the United States.

Rollins is one of 282 colleges and universities to receive grants this year. These colleges were selected by the Foundation's administrative committee with the help of a board of experienced educators.

The grants are given without any restrictions other than they be used to help meet expenses directly associated with undergraduate education.
