BEQUEST

Rollins College has been left a residence on Genius Drive, valued at \$50,000, according to the will of the late Dr. John Martin, who received an honorary degree from Rollins in 1936. Dr. Martin died in Winter Park April 6.

The handsome residence, pictured above, is situated next to that of President and Mrs. McKean and faces on Lake Virginia. It will be approximately ten months before the estate is settled and Rollins can assume possession of the handsome Spanish style home.

Dr. Martin, a noted educator and native of England came to Winter Park in 1929. A long time friend of Dr. Holt, and contributor to Dr. Holt's magazine "The Independent" he, each year until 1944, gave his John Martin series of lectures at Rollins.

There are many uses to which the mansion can be put by Rollins and according to John Tiedtke, Rollins treasurer, a careful study will be made before deciding what to use it for.

Dr. Martin, was born in Lincoln, England and was graduated from the University of Lincoln in 1889. During the latter part of the 19th century he was a friend of such outstanding figures as George Bernard Shaw, Sidney and Beatrice Webb, Ramsey MacDonald, and other forerunners of the Labor movement in England. He was a member of the executive committee of the London Fabian Society, and gave lectures to working men and women at the People's Palace in East London.

SCHOLARSHIP

A \$2,500 scholarship to enable a student from France to attend Rollins has been established by Mme. Pierre Lecomte du Nouy, widow of the author of Human Destiny. In 1952 she established a trust fund of \$3000 to award the annual essay prize of \$100 to the Rollins student writing the best essay on her husband's famous book.

\$2,000 GRANT

Rollins College is one of 186 colleges and universities to receive a grant from the Colgate-Palmolive Company. Rollins received \$2,000 dollars. The announcement came from E. H. Little, Colgate board chairman who also announced the company's recent acquisition of its new headquarters in a towering building at 300 Park Ave., New York.

In making the announcement Chairman Little said: "The Colgate-Palmolive Co., fully recognizes that its future ability to serve the nation is dependent on the caliber of men and women who will be recruited to its personnel and management.

"The colleges are doing a job for us and they are doing that job very well, despite obstacles. We deem it both a privilege and an obligation to help support their efforts.

"In choosing the schools, we consider among other criteria academic excellence, progress in improving faculty salaries, and initiative in obtaining regular support through their Alumni and other channels."

During the past two and one half years 47 business firms have contributed to the support of Rollins College, bearing out President McKean's statement when he became president: "If a college is strong enough academically, it will win its own support. I think the support industry is giving Rollins justifies this policy."

ROLLINS HOST

Rollins College acted as host to the Florida Association of Colleges and Universities at their two day meeting at the Langford Hotel in Winter Park, April 26-27. President McKean and Mayor Ray Greene '23, welcomed the Florida educators. Miss Dorothy Koehler, Registrar of Rollins, welcomed the Registrars' section of the Association.

COMMENCEMENT

Ninety-four candidates for degrees from Rollins College make up the roll of the senior class which will be graduated Friday, June 1, in Knowles Memorial Chapel, on the Campus. This will be the sixty-seventh class to be graduated at the traditional June exercises since the establishment of Rollins more than 70 years ago.

Senior Classes end May 26 and the commencement week activities will begin with the Baccalaureate Sermon by the Rev. J. Wayne Drash, of the Mirror Lake Christian Church of St. Petersburg, Sunday, May 27, and will end with the presentation of diplomas and awards Friday morning at 10:00 in the Chapel. Commencement speaker will be Harland Cleveland, New York publisher of The Reporter magazine. He is the son of former dean Marian Cleveland and spoke to the graduating class of 1953.

Highlighting the week of activities will be the President's reception for seniors and the members of their immediate family on the evening of May 31, and the luncheon for the parents of seniors in the Morse Gallery of Art. The annual breakfast at the Family Tree, when the graduating class will be guests of Alumni will be held according to tradition on the morning of graduation day. Central Florida Alumni also will give their annual dinner in honor of the graduating class at the University Club in Winter Park on the night of May 10.

According to custom the academic procession will form before Carnegie Hall at 9:30.

ART SHOW

Jeannette Genius McKean, wife of President McKean has been named honorary vice-president of the National Association of Women Artists, according to a recent announcement from New York. She has just recently closed her one-man show at the Contemporary Arts Gallery in New York City where she received high critical acclaim for her work.

RESEARCH GRANT

Dr. Donald Carroll, of the Science Department at Rollins, has been awarded an \$800 grant for research this coming summer. The grant is to help Dr. Carroll continue his research in making a series of new derivatives from alkyl cinchoninic acids. When his work is finished he will send results to Ciba Pharmaceutical Co., Summit, N. J., which made the grant. This company will make a study of his work for possible pharmacological properties. Ciba is interested in compounds having anti-tubercular and anti-spasmodic functions.

When graduation claimed last year, as it invariably does every year, some of the more prominent of Joe Justice's flannel rompers such as the All Americans Bill Cary and Connie Mack Butler along with Don Tauscher, there were dire predictions on some sides that the 1956 baseball season would be anything but brilliant. And when pitching ace Art Brophy failed to return after the first term this year there was dark muttering that all was lost, or would be, by the end of the 1956 baseball season.

Yet even the most outspoken of the pessimists have conceded that the 1956 edition of the Rollins baseball team is worthy of a place along side past Tar nines.

With Nick Vancho keeping the Tar infield tight and his .375 batting average keeping opposing pitches loose, Rollins began to roll through its 28 game schedule with comparative ease.

The big question mark in the Tar lineup was pitching but with only six games remaining as this story goes to press, Rollins is 14-7 on the season. At this time last year the soon-to-be crowned Florida State Champs had a 16-5 record.

Of the 14 games won, undefeated righthander Hal Lawler can claim seven for himself. Although Lawler has been the backbone of the mound staff, he has had able assistance from Harry Bennett, Jack Powell and Bob Richmond.

Rollins will close out the season with Florida State University in Tallahassee May 11 and 12 in a crucial two game series with the Seminoles. F.S.U. is undefeated in F.I.B.C. competition while Rollins has only one loss in state play (Florida Southern defeated Rollins for the second time in ten years). Should Rollins sweep the series it will automatically step into its fourth consecutive Florida State Championship.

Switching from baseball to another form of athletic hysteria, the Rollins crew is poised for another shot at the Florida State Rowing Championship when the state regatta is held at Tampa May 5. Dr. U. T. Bradley has coached his sweepswingers to a 5-2 season. The University of Wisconsin and Florida Southern were the only eights to mar an otherwise perfect slate. Rollins rebounded later in the season from its loss to Southern by outpulling the Mocs for a length and a half victory on Lake Maitland. The win over Southern would tend to make Rollins odds on favorite to keep its string of state rowing championships intact.

Continuing to gambol along through the athletic gauntlet, the tennis team under the first year leadership of alumnus Norm Copeland has earned a 9-5 record thus far in the season and is ranked nationally in the first top ten of college net squads.

Rollins golfers are shooting slightly under par for the season and much of the credit goes to the steady shooting of Frank Boynton and Marlene Stewart. Marlene, Canadian National Open
