MINUTES OF THE FACULTY 1954-55

The sixth meeting of the Rollins College Faculty was held at 4:30 P. Mr. McKean called the meeting to order. In speaking of Founders' Week activities he reported that \$18,000. had been cleared on the dinner.

Mr. Mendell announced that at the Trustee Meeting a committee was set up to complete the work on the by-laws by June. The Committee will consist of two local trustees, Mr. Dickie and Mr. Craig, the President, the Dean, the college attorney, and two faculty members. The Faculty Administration Committee appointed Mr. Vestal and Mr. Mendell to serve on this committee.

At the request of Mr. McKean, Mr. Mikula, Admissions Counsellor, reported favorable and unfavorable comments on and impressions of Rollins. He pointed out the importance of statements from students presently on the campus in the recruiting of new students. To improve the enrollment picture, he stressed the need of keeping students here for four years, emphasizing the fact that it is easier to keep students than to replace them.

Mr. McKean asked that the faculty report to him the names of students who were thinking of not returning next year.

Mr. Stone reported that Professor William H. Lloyd, Sr. of the original Rollins Faculty had passed away on February 27, 1955 in Biggs, Oklahoma. He moved the adoption of the following resolution: "That the Faculty of Rollins College express its deepest sympathy to his granddaughter Mrs. R. C. Thompson of Louisville, Kentucky and to any other survivors." Seconded and carried.

On motion of Dean Darrah the meeting adjourned at 5:15 (?) P. M.
