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MINUTES OF THE FACULTY - 1943-44

The tenth meeting of the Rollins College faculty for the year 1943-44 was called to order by President Holt at 4:20 p.m. Wednesday, May 31, in Dyer Memorial.

Nancy Corbett presented a petition from the Student Council, asking that the faculty restore ratting in order to increase college spirit and make a discrimination between classes.

It was moved by Mrs. Lamb, seconded by Mrs. Acree, that ratting be restored with the restrictions that may be imposed by the Dean of Women and the Dean of Men.

Dr. France offered an amendment that this should be for one year only; seconded by Mr. Jones. The amendment was accepted by the mover and the second and passed as amended.

President Holt presented the question of granting the diploma to Margaret Hult with the understanding that she will make up the work which she has missed by her serious illness. On the motion of Mr. Jones, seconded by Dr. France, it was voted that the diploma be granted.

Dean Cleveland asked the cooperation of the faculty in not allowing the girls to wear shorts in class.

Miss Treat reminded the faculty that senior grades are due tomorrow.

Dean Stone reminded the faculty that in checking grade cards there should be no checks on the lines and the summary should be consistent with the other check marks. He emphasized the fact that the comments are useful in recommendations, etc., and **stressed the point** that they should be on character rather than scholarship.

Dean Stone asked that summer addresses be filed by June 3 if possible.

He announced that the first faculty meeting next fall will be September 25.

Dean Stone made Commencement announcements and Miss Packham appealed to members of the faculty to prepare skits for the faculty senior dinner.

Miss Treat presented the candidates for degrees.

On the motion of Mr. Jones, seconded by Dr. France, it was voted that Henry Tilden Swan, III be granted credit for the work taken at Dartmouth and given his degree.

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On the motion of Dr. France, it was voted that William Daniel Nobles, Jr. be allowed to complete his work in medical school and that he be listed with the candidates for June 5, 1944, with a star indicating that he will receive his diploma when he has completed one term of medical school satisfactorily.

On the motion of Mr. Jones, seconded by Dr. Young, it was voted that Eileen Wells be granted a waiver of two terms in the Upper Division.
