MINUTES OF THE FACULTY for February 16, 1943

The third meeting of the Faculty for 1942-43 was called to order on February 16 at 4:20 p.m. by President Holt in Dyer Memorial.

The following members were present: President Holt, Mr. Apgar, Miss Cameron, Mr. Carlo, Mr. Charmbury, Dr. Clarke, Dean Cleveland, Mr. Davis, Mr. Dougherty, Dean Edmonds, Dean Enyart, Mr. Eskridge, Dr. Field, Dr. Firestone, Dr. Fort, Dr. France, Mr. Granberry, Mr. Hanna, Dr. Hasbrouck, Miss Henry, Dr. P. Hutchings, Dr. W. President Holt announced that the College would be open next year.

Dean Cleveland presented the following report from the Committee on Fraternity Rushing:

"The Faculty Committee on Fraternity and Sorority Rushing, appointed by the President, met and unanimously recommended that rushing be deferred to the beginning of the sophomore year, or in the case of transfers, until they have been at Rollins for three terms; rushing otherwise to remain the same as it has been for the past two years.

"The members of the Committee have felt for some time that this change should be made in order to avoid the confusion and distraction from academic interests for the entering students at the outset of their college career. Due to the War and the various changes brought about by present conditions, the present time seems to the Committee the time to put into effect this long contemplated program."

Dean Enyart moved that the report of the committee be accepted.

Mr. Weinberg offered an amendment that the regulations apply to sororities only; seconded by Dean Cleveland. Vote on the amendment lost.

The report adopted.

Dean Stone spoke on the following subjects:

The conferences under the one-hour plan.

Report cards. On motion of Mr. Mendell, seconded by Dr. France, it was voted that as far as possible the grade should correspond to the ratings on the card.

Necessity of regular and prompt filing of attendance reports.

Dr. Clarke suggested that the absence report be indicated on the student side of the report card.

Advisory system, with suggestions to the advisers.

Registration for the spring and summer terms, and interview forms.

Dean Stone suggested that students who will complete their work at the end of the summer term should be considered as seniors for the current year, and he indicated that unless there was an objection this would be carried out.

Dean Stone asked that the names of all students who do not plan to return next year be given to Miss Treat and suggested that an important way of getting students to return is by writing letters to parents, indicating their progress.

It was voted that no classes be held on Founders' Day.

Dr. France brought up the subject of ratting.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
