MINUTES OF FACULTY for September 24, 1942

The first meeting of the Rollins College Faculty for the year 1942-43 was called to order by President Holt at 4 p.m. on Thursday, September 24, in the library.

President Holt welcomed the new faculty and read the list of those who have gone into the service of the country. As Lieutenants in the Navy: Thurston Adams, George C. Holt, Hugh McKean, Wendell H. Langdon, Charles A. Steel, U. T. Bradley, Lawrence E. Kinsler. As Lieutenant in the Army Signal Corps, Rhea M. Smith; as Army Chaplain, Lieutenant E. C. Nance, and Private Robert Burns

He also announced the death of Mrs. Von Fruthaler, Ralph Adams Cram, and John Eaton Wagner, who was killed in service. He reported that Captain Charles L. Cobb was reported "missing in action." (Since then word has been received of his safe return.)

President Holt introduced the new members of the faculty and staff.

A telegram of good wishes from Rudolph Fischer was read.

President Holt announced the marriages of Dr. Fort and Mr. Trowbridge.

President Holt announced that it is proposed to offer the Pelican to the service of the Coast Guard for the duration.

Dean Enyart spoke of the Orientation Week program and called attention to the all-College tea to which everyone was invited.

Dr. Waite reported that 142 new students had been accepted.

Dr. Stone gave a welcome to the returning faculty from the "Home Guard" and announced a faculty meeting to be held on Monday at 10:30. He reported that the Summer School had been very successful with about one hundred students enrolled. He also announced the meeting of advisers for new students on Friday at nine o'clock.

The health service for the faculty has been discontinued for the sake of economy.

Dean Enyart announced the C.P.T. program and the enlistment in the Reserve Corps for students.

Automobile licenses have been discontinued to save metal.

Mr. Brown announced that Mr. Ward is in charge of the budget this year and that Mr. Mutispaugh will handle requests for supplies. He announced also that a number of students are available for work projects. He suggested that Mrs. Patterson be given news items on students. He announced the group insurance for new members and reported that every employee is covered by workmen's compensation insurance.

Mr. Ward announced that Dubsdread privileges have been continued this year. He announced that home football games have been turned over to the Army Emergency Relief and that everyone must pay the regular admission fee.

Mr. Mutispaugh asked that the faculty anticipate their needs for new materials on account of the difficulty of getting supplies. He asked also that they patronize the Book Store and the Center.

Mrs. Wilcox suggested that a telegram be sent to Dean Cleveland and that letters be sent to the men in service.

Meeting adjourned at 4:40 p.m.
