MINUTES OF THE FACULTY for January 16, 1941

The third meeting of the Rollins College Faculty for the year 1940-41 was called to order by President Holt at 4:05 P.M., Thursday, January 16, in Knowles 523.

Miss Weber asked that the date for the Fiesta this year be Thursday, February 13. On the motion of Professor Lamb, seconded by Professor Weinberg, it was voted that this date be approved.

On the motion of Professor Weinberg, seconded by Miss Weber, it was voted that classes be dismissed on that day immediately after lunch.

Professor Mendell read the report of the Faculty-Student Court, including recommendations for changes in the announcement made to students before vacations. On the motion of Professor Weinberg, seconded by Professor Waite, the report was accepted.

President Holt introduced Dr. Mowat who spoke briefly.

Professor Shor announced that the American Association of University Professors meeting set for Monday evening will be held early so that members can attend the reception at President Holt's given in honor of Dr. Mowat.

The meeting adjourned at 4:20 P.M.

Subject: Absence at beginning and end of terms

1. The Faculty-Student Court has studied at length the problem of getting students to attend the first and last classes of each term. The Court would not have the faculty abandon efforts to enlist the cooperation of students for better attendance. At the same time, it feels that some penalty is desirable for offenders. The penalty should be related to the offense. It should be clear. It should bear equally upon all offenders. It should be readily understandable, in advance. To establish such a penalty, the Court recommends that the faculty establish the following principles, to go into effect at the end of this term.
2. Any student who is absent without excuse from the first meeting of a course, seminar or physical education class for which he is registered, shall not be allowed to take that work in that term.
3. Any student who at the beginning of a term returns late without excuse, after failing to register at the end of the previous term, shall not be allowed to take the courses on his plan sheet for that term.
4. Any student who is absent without excuse from the last scheduled meeting of any course, seminar or physical education class at the end of a term, shall be placed on social probation for one half the following term. Statement of this probation shall not be put on the student's permanent record.
5. These rules shall be administered by the student deans.
