A special meeting of the Rollins College Faculty was called to order by President Holt at 5:00 P.M., Thursday, February 2, in Knowles 523.

President Holt announced that the Trustees had not approved the two-day solicitation for the Student Union Building in Orlando and Winter Park and that it had therefore been given up.

President Holt announced that the Dramatics Department would like to make a tour of the state with the play "Lightnin'". Fred Stone will take the financial responsibility and provide a business manager. The proceeds should be sufficient to complete the necessary funds for the laboratory theatre, thus releasing Recreation Hall for the physical education work.

In the course of the discussion it was reported that the tour would start in Palm Beach and after playing there and in Miami, the students would return for a few days before making a trip down the west coast, and perhaps a later trip up the east coast. The tour will continue only if it proves successful.

Professor Honaas asked whether the students would be away at Founders' Week and for the Bach Festival, as the absence of these students would disorganize his work. He was assured that they were expected to be here during Founders' Week.

On inquiry from Dr. Newman, President Holt assured the faculty that no student will be allowed to go without permission from the parents.

Professor Allen told the faculty that he does not wish to take any student who will be unable to make up the work missed.

It was moved by Professor Weinberg, seconded by Dean Enyart, that the administration grant permission for the students to be absent from the campus for the purpose of this tour and that the faculty be requested to grant the students permission to make up the work missed in whatever way is best for the faculty. An amendment offered by Dr. Newman that the motion read "to make up the work missed as far as is humanly possible" was accepted by Professor Weinberg and Dean Enyart. After further discussion the motion was CARRIED. *then and the student*

On the motion of Professor Weinberg the meeting adjourned at 5:50.
