The third special meeting of the Rollins College Faculty on the curriculum reports was called to order by President Holt at 4:05 P.M., Thursday, March 10, in Knowles 523.

The following members were present: President Holt, Dean Anderson, Professor Allen, Dr. Armstrong, Professor Blanche Bloch, Mr. Brown, Mrs. Cass, Dr. Clarke, Professor Cox, Miss Daves, Mr. Denney, Dean Enyart, Dr. Farley, Dr. Feuerstein, Professor France, Professor Glass, Professor Granberry, Dr. Grover, Professor Hagopian, Professor Hanna, Professor Harris, Professor Honaas, Dr. William Hutchings, Dr. Kinsler, Professor Lamb, Dr. Melcher, Mr. Mendell, Dr. Newman, Miss Ortmayer, Professor Packham, Mr. Rae, Professor Roney, Professor Shor, Professor Siewert, Dr. Smith, Dean Sprague, Dr. Stone, Miss Treat, Professor Trowbridge, Dr. Waddington, Mr. Waite, Miss Weber, Professor Weinberg, Dr. Young, Mr. Yust, Dr. Phyllis Hutchings.

President Holt introduced two visitors, Mrs. Laidlaw and Mrs. Endicott, and announced that Dr. Grover had been made vice-president and would be relieved of his teaching duties the coming term so that he might devote his time to financial matters.

Dean Anderson urged the faculty to see their advisees so that all may register before the close of the term. He also reminded the faculty that report cards should in no circumstances be given to students but sent by mail or brought by the instructor in person to the office.

Dean Anderson announced that a few members of the faculty have not had their health examinations as required by the State.

Dean Anderson spoke of the seriousness of the absence problem and asked the faculty to give the matter special attention during the spring term.

Professor Honaas announced the Faculty recitals and the low rates granted to the College for the series.

The secretary read a card of thanks from Mrs. Burks, and at President Holt's suggestion the Faculty stood a few moments in silence in honor of Dr. Burks.

The secretary read a petition from Carl Kettles for the waiving of the two-term Upper Division requirement. On the motion of Professor Weinberg, seconded by Dean Enyart, it was voted to dispense with this requirement in his case.

Dean Sprague presented a request from the student council for permission to have an all-college dance on the evening of Wednesday, March 16. On the motion of Professor France, seconded by Professor Weinberg, this was granted.

Professor Weinberg moved that the motion to adopt the new curriculum report be amended to read that the three reports be turned over to the Faculty Council. Seconded by Dr. William Hutchings.

After discussion the motion was put to a vote and lost.

The students were then called in and discussion was carried on by Dr. Melcher and Dr. Kinsler.

Professor Weinberg moved adjournment.

Meeting adjourned at 5:15 P.M.
