Minutes of the Faculty for January 31, 1930

The fifth meeting of the Hollin College Faculty for the year 1929-30 was called to order by Dean Anderson in Room #766, Sparrell, at 4:10 p.m., Friday, January 31.

The following members were present: Deans Anderson and Bingham, Professors Campbell, Bueno, Uphof, Weinberg, Georgia, Jenks, Forbes, Wattles, Glass, Bingham, H.F.Harris, L.D.Harris, Pierce, Grover, Mason, France, Cole, Newby, D.Thomas, and Mrs. Parsons, Mrs. Carlson, Mrs. Cass, Miss Wensell, Miss Shor, and Mr. Martin, Mr. Meyer and Miss Treat.

Mr. William Reid, in behalf of the TOMOKAN staff, invited the Faculty to a tea dance, February 8th in Recreation Hall from four to six, tickets to be fifty cents. He also announced the price of the TOMOKAN as \$5.00, \$2.50 down and the remainder to be paid later.

Notes of thanks for flowers were then read from Mrs. Sprague and Mrs. Packard.

The next business was the calendar for the new catalog. The opening of College will be September 29, 1930; end of the fall term, December 19 with 3 days holiday at Thanksgiving; opening of the winter term, January 5, 1931; end of winter term, March 21; opening of spring term, March 25; close of College, June 8. A motion to accept the above calendar was made by Professor Grover, seconded by Professor Bueno. CARRIED.

Entrance requirements were then taken up and discussed: English, 3 units; Mathematics, 2; History, 1; Science, 1; Language, 2; Vocational units, not over 3; and a total of 15 units. A motion to accept the above requirements was made by Professor Georgia and seconded by Professor Weinberg. CARRIED.

The number of Honor Points required for cum laude, magna cum laude and summa cum laude was then taken up. The number requisite for summa cum laude was changed from 576 to 550, giving a small margin from a complete "A" grade. The requisite number of points for other honors to be adjusted accordingly. It was moved by Professor Weinberg, seconded by Professor France to accept the above requirements. CARRIED.

The necessity of Latin for graduation was the next topic. Students not having two years of Latin for entrance must complete that work before the end of the sophomore year - if they are candidates for an A.B. degree. If a student changes his major upon entering the junior class - from B.S. to A.B., making Latin necessary for graduation, Latin will have to be taken but without receiving credit for it in hours and points. Motion to accept the above requirements made by Professor Jenks, seconded by Professor Georgia. CARRIED.

A motion to have a Resolutions Committee appointed was made by Mrs. Harris, seconded by Mrs. Cole. CARRIED.

Faculty Minutes, January 31, 1930 - p.2

The recommendations of the Student Association in regard to chapel were read and discussed. After various suggestions it was moved to accept the recommendations abolishing compulsory chapel, and also regular days for chapel, and to try this plan for this term. Motion to accept made by Professor France, seconded by Professor Bingham. An amendment was made substituting the word "assembly" for "chapel". Both original motion and amendment were carried.
