The meeting was called to order by Dean Carrothers in the absence of President Holt, who arrived later in the afternoon.

Announcement was made of the appointment of Doctor Burks to handle all cases of illness, except operations, in the College next year, all students to pay a fee of five dollars for such medical service. This service is open to members of the faculty as well as students. However, it will be necessary for faculty members to enroll for this before College opens and not wait until they get sick.

The question of opening and closing hours was tabled on motion of Professor Weinberg.

It was agreed that "The Bookery" should handle college textbooks next year.

The matter of extra credits for students was left to the decision of the Scholarship Committee.

The case of Harold Daniels was discussed at length. On motion of Professor Georgia, seconded by Professor Jenks, the matter was tabled pending Mr. Daniels' good behavior and he was placed under the friendly supervision of Doctor Campbell.

The matter of reviving the fraternity for debating was approved if found desirable. It was agreed that all honorary fraternities should be approved by the Dean and have at least two members of the faculty in its membership.

President Holt brought up the question of formulating a petition to the Florida Legislature opposing the bill now pending to forbid the teaching of Evolution. Professor Georgia was made chairman of the committee to meet at 3:30 P. M., April 22, in Professor Grover's room, to go into the subject thoroly.
