MINUTES OF FACULTY MEETING.  
January 15, 1926.

A set of new rules for Rollins, as drawn up by Dean Sprague, was read and discussed. Several members of the Faculty then asked that they be typed and given to the Faculty for perusal and digestion. The case of Larkins was then discussed, and motion made and carried that he be placed on probation for the remainder of this semester. A number of those on the probation list were taken up and discussed it was then moved, seconded and carried that-All students not passing in twelve hours should be dropped, unless in the opinion of the Faculty Council, there are adequate extenuating circumstances, which justify giving him special consideration.

A discussion of the term "dropped" ended in the motion--if a student is "dropped" in any semester, he cannot return until the following year, to College. Carried unanimously.

A motion to adjourn was then in order.
