FACULTY MEETING--March 10, 1926.

" The Joint Council" paragraph was first business discussed, a motion was made by Mrs. Harris, seconded Mrs. Callahan, Carried-- that a new committee be appointed by Chair to revise this section. New Committee -- Mrs. Harris--Mr. Draa and Coach Talman.

Coach Talman moved the Faculty be assessed \$1.00 each, for general purposes, seconded by Mr. Draa, Carried. Mrs. Cass was appointed Treasurer. Miss Boyce reported the Audobon Tea at Phi Alpha House amounted to \$10.07. The following members of the Faculty paid at once and bill was "Paid"--Miss Gartland; Prof. Feuerstein; Coach Talman; Miss Boyce; Dr & Mrs. Taintor; Mrs. Newby; Dr. Boice; Prof. and Mrs. Harris.

Miss Boyce, Profs. Weinberg and Feuerstein made Committee to see about picnic.

Senior privileges to be left to Faculty Council.

Morris Bartlett, Byron Reeves and Cecil Trantham, moved by Coach Talman and second by Prof. Weinberg that they be dropped for poor class work. Carried. Bartlett, on account of broken arm, on probation Alec Crawford, Wendell Moore --their cases were next discussed and on motion by Prof. Harris and second of Prof. Weinberg, that they be put on probation till April 25, when their work is to be made-up or they will be dropped.

The case of Lynn Williams was taken up and discussed--his fate was left in the hands of Faculty Council.
