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Minutes, College of Arts & Sciences Faculty Meeting, October 14, 1926

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October 14, 1926.

Meeting was opened by President Holt who said he wished to make clear the matter of smoking in the College. He said that he felt there should be no smoking in the classrooms under any circumstances; that students could smoke on the campus when they wished to do so, but not in any building except Chase Hall. Dean Gartland asked what rules we had, if any, with reference to girl students' smoking. After consulting with the Faculty, it was announced that the same rules applied to girls and boys - that girls could smoke on the campus but not in the buildings.

A two hour discussion of the two hour system followed. Among the main points and suggestions made were the following:

Miss McVea: That we ought to decide ^{what} to do with students who complete the assigned work.

Professor Feuerstein: That much benefit would be derived from group meetings by teachers having similar or related subjects.

Professor Georgia: That he expected to hold examinations from time to time on whatever work students had covered.

Professor Bailey: That it would be impossible and undesirable to do away with the lectures completely in certain subjects.

Dr. Thomas and Dr. Campbell agreed with Professor Bailey that through a lecture, the teacher's personality impressed the subject upon the student and furnished common ground more easily.

A committee composed of Dean Carrothers, Coach Orr, Professor Weinberg, Mr. Short and Miss McVea was appointed to report on the feasibility of the two hour plan for students who work and play football.
