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Minutes, College of Arts & Sciences Faculty Meeting, September 17, 1926

Arts & Sciences Faculty

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September 17, 1926.

Meeting called to order by President Holt. Greetings were extended to the new members of the Faculty.

President announced the coming of Mr. Root of Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio, for the purpose of looking over our Library and making plans to make our library facilities perfect. He urged the professors to make suggestions when Mr. Root comes.

Dean Carrothers then introduced the new faculty members individually. He announced that it had been decided to permit students to carry a maximum of 17 hours, except in special cases where they might be extended to 18, but further than that they could not go. Dr. Sprague asked about our attitude towards increased number of hours in view of high marks. Dean Carrothers replied that the hours could be increased to 18 on a grade of 90% or above.

Dean Carrothers announced that all college cuts would be eliminated this year. Careful records of attendance are to be kept but no cuts are to be especially reported.

Dean Carrothers suggested that each member of the faculty be asked to take charge of the chapel service two or three times during the year and to make the period worth while. Dr. Thomas spoke on the importance of voluntary chapel and church attendance.

It was announced that the fraternities and sororities have agreed to do no "rushing" for the first few weeks.

Dean Carrothers announced several calls for graduate work, but stated that the college was not prepared to give such work unless student was assistant to a professor. Professors were asked to post office hours in the hall. Adjournment.
