NOVEMBER 27, 1917

The eighth faculty meeting of the year was held Tuesday afternoon at four o'clock in the President's office, Carnegie Hall, with the President in the Chair.

Dr. French opened the meeting with the following present:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

#2- November 27, 1917.

Under report of Dean Dr. French made inquiry concerning a number of absences.

Dean Short brought up the question of tardiness. President French suggested that if a tardiness is serious it should be considered an absence and treated as such.

President French suggested reports on the work of students and it was decided to issue reports each month on the following basis:

- A - 90 to 100%
- B - 80 to 90
- C - 70 to 80
- D - 60 to 70
- E - 50 to 60

with 70 as a passing grade.

It was also decided to leave to the discretion of the teacher the matter of excusing a student who had an average grade of from 90 to 100% from semester examinations.

Miss Gladwin reported more disturbance in the Sub-Preparatory Department.

Donald Vincent's absences were discussed and Dean Short said she expected to see his father in regard to the matter shortly.

After a short report on the percentage of students attending chapel, it was decided to take no action in regard to recording absences.

#3- November 27, 1917.

Dean Short asked concerning excusing students for absences incurred before and after holidays, especially the approaching Thanksgiving Day. On motion of Prof. Rencher

It was voted to allow no excuses for absences incurred before or after holidays and that a student would receive zero for each subject if not present.

There being no further business the Chair adjourned the meeting at 4.45 p.m.
