Highlights of Trustees' actions & reports

- **Student life** - The Board of Trustees has established a Student Life Committee. The new standing committee will oversee the College's goal of providing a safe and healthy campus environment that promotes students' well-being and academic success. The current search for a vice president for student affairs is expected to conclude with an appointment this spring.

- **The Alford Inn at Rollins** - [The Alford Inn](#) will open for business in mid-August with an official ribbon-cutting ceremony to follow on October 10, 2013. Barbara Alford '68, an avid and knowledgeable art collector, will treat guests to an impressive showcase of contemporary art to be housed at The Alford Inn.

- **Additional construction updates**
 - Completion of the Archibald Granville Bush Science Center is expected in July, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony planned for September 12, 2013.
 - Construction commences on Phase 2 of the Strong Hall quadrangle in September 2013, for occupancy in fall 2014. Total capacity of the four units will be 100, an increase of 70 from the original structure.
 - Renovation of the Cornell Campus Center will be phased over two summers, with summer 2013 focused on kitchen renovations, equipment replacements, and infrastructure upgrades. The College's food service provider, Sodexo, is providing \$2 million in capital improvement funding for the project.

High-impact practices key to student success

Central to Rollins' strategic planning is how to leverage "high-impact" practices. National research indicates that students who are involved in two or more high-impact educational experiences throughout their college career will have greater satisfaction, retention, and overall learning. Examples of high-impact practices include service learning, living-learning communities, student-

faculty collaborative scholarship, internships, and diversity/global learning, all of which provide opportunities for students to forge a strong connection to the institution.

Service increasingly part of the Rollins experience
