 - 1. Cafes will open on weekends next semester
 - a. Possibility of 7:30 am-12 pm timeframe
 - iii. Nutritional values
 - 1. MyFitness Pal app
 - 2. Dining hall will have touchscreen next semester to track calories in meals
 - iv. Q-Bot system
 - 1. Down for six weeks
 - 2. Rewards for on campus meal purchases
 - 3. 347 people have signed up, 953 people have looked at app
 - v. Bagel bar knives contamination
 - 1. Gustavo will get back to Matt
 - 2. Request other knives from employees
 - 3. Health safety regulations and allergy liabilities
- b. Campus safety policies
 - i. Campus safety has new policy to enter unlocked rooms
 - 1. Rumor has not been confirmed
- c. Senator contracts
 - i. Constitution has been amended to include senator responsibilities
 - 1. Senators are required to read their responsibilities in constitution, instead of signing separate contract
- d. Constituent outreaches
 - i. Examples of constituent outreaches
 - 1. Cookies outside library to ask for feedback
 - 2. Organizational senators can participate in events with their organization
 - 3. Ask constituents of your own year for feedback
 - 4. Signatures for petitioning causes
 - 5. Box at table for anonymous feedback drop
 - 6. Post in class Facebook group
 - 7. Tabling/sitting in library, residence halls, and other public places
 - 8. Dividing up outreaches throughout semester
