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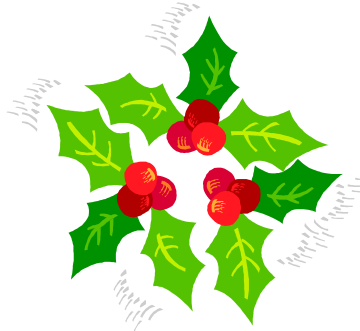

During our next faculty meeting Amy Gross from Kansas State University to discuss the teaching evaluation process.

Course Integration.....Jane Reimers

Examples of current course integration, i.e. Jane and Clay using a case that the students begin in ACC 502 and then continue and expand in FIN 501, and Mary and Clay jointly doing a case in the same term in the INB and FIN classes were discussed. The challenge is to come up with way to continue this process and bring integration to other classes.

Curriculum Committee Update.....Clay Singleton

The curriculum committee reported that its activities for the year center around collecting and systematizing our assurance of learning assessments. The committee is primarily focused on collecting the surveys and assessments being conducted on: Excel skills, presentation skills, leadership, domestic practica, global consulting projects, and curriculum content. Most of these assessments have been administered inconsistently and the committee is working to organize and analyze the results. These assessments are essential to our next AACSB review. The committee is also working to establish a writing skills web site as well as explore the possibility of a writing workshop, perhaps during project week.

CIBER Grants Discussion.....Jim Johnson

Jim explained the CIBER grant process. CIBER: Center for International Education and Research. The main grant is to set up a center. Currently there are 26 CIBERS around the country. The average amt of the grants are \$360,000 per year for a 4 year period. The faculty gave Jim the go ahead to research further the possibility of applying for this grant. Additional information will be discussed in future faculty meetings.
