 - a. Students must consent to being put on list
 - iii. Work study position or community service position
 - 1. Looking for Wednesday through Saturday from 9pm – 2 am
 - a. Would require about 20 hours a week
 - 2. If SGA funded, Campus Safety would provide golf cart and radio
 - a. Campus Safety would also provide training for any available senators



- iv. Rave Guardian app
 - 1. Encourage more downloads through IFC, Panhellenic, sports teams, and other organizations
 - a. Also spoke with Sodexo to put announcements in napkin holders
 - v. Campus Safety rides
 - 1. Campus Safety is willing to give students rides on campus
 - 2. Will not give rides from college quarter
 - a. Students are responsible for their off-campus locations
 - i. Students should be contacting Winter Park police if off-campus
 - 3. Campus Safety has less staffing to provide rides for the high call volume they receive
 - a. Will give priority to emergencies if student indicates
 - vi. Bike locks are available in Campus Safety
 - vii. Annual safety and fire report is provided to students
 - a. Students are welcome to read for more information on Campus Safety

X. Open Forum

- a. Campus Safety (Romulo Rainha)
 - i. Rides are privileges during the day, with the exception of students with disabilities
 - 1. Rides are also privileges during the night, but Campus Safety will not refuse rides
 - a. Rides are designed for students with disabilities, but Campus Safety offers rides to all students
 - ii. Disability look-up list
 - 1. If you are registered on the disability services list, it eliminates the repeated sharing of said illness
 - a. Will be included on list, but illness will be not be disclosed
 - b. If students choose not to be on list, they are still able to give reason for rides
 - iii. Off-campus student contact with Campus Safety
 - 1. Contact Campus Safety through Rave Guardian app
 - a. Can forward to information to police if Campus Safety is used as guardian off-campus
 - 2. Campus Safety does not have jurisdiction past campus lines
 - a. Parking garage and crosswalk is considered campus

- i. Annual fire and safety report provides parameters of campus
 - iv. Elise and Romulo met with Campus Safety last semester
 - 1. SGA golf cart is a liability to school
 - v. Campus Safety understaffing within department
 - 1. Not enough officers for the population of students
 - 2. Campus Safety offered work study/community service position to account for high call volume
 - a. Work study position is being considered to provide for more than escort rides for Campus Safety office
 - i. Would also help answering phones
 - b. Community service position seems more feasible option
 - 3. Next Campus Safety meeting will be on February 19 to discuss possibility of these positions
 - b. Meeting locations (Matt Cassidy)
 - i. Emailed Julia LaBeouf about meeting spaces in Galloway for next semester
 - 1. SGA has priority if we choose to use room
 - a. SGA was previously held in Galloway room
 - b. Students recognize when senate is being held in Galloway
 - c. More available for students to access meetings in Bieberbach-Reed room
 - 2. Meeting space can be addressed for this semester, or for next semester when new SGA takes office
 - a. Suggestion for Matt to draft resolution for next meeting for meeting space this semester
 - 3. **Voting for change of meeting space: motion denied**
- c. Course evaluations (Hunter Wood)
 - i. Met with professors to discuss evaluations
 - 1. Course evaluations deadlines are in the works to be extended
 - 2. Possibility of limiting email notifications for course evaluations
 - 3. Some professors wouldn't mind utilizing class time at the end of the semester
 - a. Professors have the ability to choose to utilize class time
- d. Rave Guardian app marketing (Phillip Denizard)
 - i. Phillip would like organizational senators to agree to marketing to their constituents
 - 1. Phillip will provide marketing materials to all senators who agree to promote with their constituents
- e. Uber (Rob Salmeron)
 - i. Uber has asked about Rollins interest in Rollins-Uber partnership
 - 1. Rollins could either subsidize costs or fund costs for night time rides



- a. SGA could allot money for pilot program, and then choose to fund for future programs depending on success
 - i. Would promote safety of students
 - 1. Would also be available for students' choice of locations
 - ii. Helpful in promoting SGA on campus
- 2. Rollins frequently utilizes Uber services
- 3. Parameters of Uber ride drop-off/pick-up locations
 - a. SGA would provide budget and after budget is used up, app would not be available for students
 - b. Possibility of providing a percentage of funding for Uber rides
- f. Parking (Zach Braudy)
 - i. Meghan Harte-Weyant, Leon Hayner, and Ken Miller attended senate last semester
 - 1. Discussed possibility of students parking in gym parking lot after hours
 - a. Currently not an available option
 - 2. Campus Safety will look into increased students-only parking
 - a. Request Campus Safety ad-hoc committee follow-up
