Minutes of the SLC meeting of Feb 14th, 2006. (Unapproved)

1. Call to order: Bernal called the meeting to order at 12:30 p.m.

II. Summary of discussion:

Cat McConnell gave an update on the Honor Code implementation and the efforts to find faculty advisors.

We started a conversation on the Social Honor Code. Diane (representing Dean Neilson) talked about the current code of student conduct and how it might be reorganized in light of the new academic Honor Code.

The committee considered the purpose and use of the social honor code. It concluded that we should aim for a document that can be printed in an R-times format for the students to use. The document should include descriptions of all the procedures and violations. It was agreed that the document did not need faculty approval because it did not contain new material.

Diane, Cat McConnell, and Dean Neilson agreed to get together to come up with a draft.

At the end of the meeting there was further discussion of the implementation plans for the academic Honor code. This conversation was purely informational, as the SLC has no implementation responsibilities.
